A broad variety of transport related stakeholders need, use, and collect high-quality data, but no one shares them in a commonly known and accessible place. This is resulting in varying metrics and often such information is only published in PDFs and uploaded to a diverse range of websites. A common, shared and frequently updated database for the transport sector is not available in the public domain – yet.

More than 20 international organisations have identified that challenge in May 2022. With our own in-kind resources, we have started to create a common vision and are in the process of developing a prototype of the database. Within 5 years, we aim at sharing more than 10,000 (mainly national) datasets and connecting 1,000 global data sources and supporting better NDCs, ambitious policy making and leveraging large scale investment.

The goals of the workshop are:

- Connecting with further partners to enhance the Partnership
- Reflecting data sharing options for bi- and multilateral development banks
