

COP 17 adopted the guidelines for the preparation of biennial update reports (BURs) from non-Annex I Parties. These guidelines indecision 2/CP.17 and annex III outline the objectives and scope of the information to be reported. The COP decided that non-Annex I Parties, consistent with their capabilities and the level of support provided for reporting, should submit their first BUR by December 2014, and that the least developed country Parties and small island developing States may submit BURs at their Support for the Preparation of discretion.
